All Change at Loxdale

We will soon be undergoing some fairly large change to our computer information systems and this will mean that parents and carers can interact with us differently. From June onwards, we will be using a new system in school to record children's data, manage school meal payments and to send texts/emails. The new system, called Arbor, will be a lot more user friendly and will replace systems and apps that you may already be familiar with, bringing them together into one place. We expect to roll out the new app for parents to use ready in time for the start of the new academic year in September. Very Important: We have always encouraged parents to pay for school meals in advance and stress that this will be especially important during this transition period to ensure a smooth transfer of your account. Any unpaid/overdue balances may create difficulties when setting up accounts on the new system.

The Summer Book Fair is on its way!!!

School will be holding a Book Fair from Monday 12th to Thursday 15th June. The children will be taken to the Book Fair in school and will be able to view the books on offer. If they wish to purchase a book or books they will then be given the opportunity to select and buy them.

Internet safety This half-term the pastoral team invited our police Early Help Officers into school to work with Year 6 pupils on keeping safe online. School Meals Price increase

The cost for school meals has always been heavily subsidised by the school. For at least the last 5 years, whilst supply costs have increased, other schools have increased their charges each year. However, at Loxdale, we have managed to keep the cost of school meals to only £2.20 per meal.

The school currently pays £3.32 per meal, having seen an increase of 17% over the last 12 months.

Unfortunately, Governors have agreed the difficult decision to increase the cost of school meals from September 2023. The new charges from September 2023 will be £2.40 per meal. This will mean that school meals for a normal 5-day week will be £12 instead of £11, representing a 9.1% increase.

The school will continue to subsidise each meal by 92p in order to maintain these prices.

Over the coming weeks they will be taking up duties at lunch time to support fellow pupils who made need a helping hand or somebody to talk to. Reflexions

We are proud to have been allocated as part of the next wave of schools selected to be a part of Reflexions Mental Health in Schools Team (MHST). This is a new service which will help increase access to mental health support for children and young people in schools. The MHST works alongside the school's Senior Designated Mental Health Lead (Miss Hanley) and school staff to identify, discuss and plan for the school's mental health and emotional wellbeing needs.

The team work closely with children and young people who may need support with:

*Low mood *Exam stress *Problems with sleep

> *Low self-esteem * Anxiety.

They have already begun working with some of our children and their families and will be hosting a Reflexions introduction session for parents & carers in June.
