

Loxdale Primary School Sports Premium Funding Review 2018-2019



Article 29: Goals of Education

At Loxdale, we recognise the contribution of PE and sport to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

Our Primary School PE and Sport's Funding will enable us to continue and extend our provision through employing additional sports professionals, entering into more competitive sports competitions, improving sporting opportunities in the wider area and new sporting equipment.

What is the Sports Premium Funding? The PE and sport premium is government funding to help primary schools improve the quality of PE and sport activities. Schools receive PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6. Each school will receive a lump sum allocated for sport. The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2018 to 2019 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

- To encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.
- To increase attainment in PE and sport.
- To ensure sustainability in our PE and sports provision.
- The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in supporting PE and sport at Loxdale.
